Gathering sets of knowledge


- Lukenya, Kenya October 2007, where the first exercise to develop a set of gender responsive criteria took place, mainly with a grassroots-focused set of participants.
- Bagamoyo, Tanzania, March 2008, where a second exercise took place, drawing on land professionals (surveyors, urban planners, engineers etc). To complement this knowledge.
- Very useful outputs from both identifying different dimensions.

- How can the gender responsiveness of large scale tools be determined?

Land Professionals - Factors

Critical factors influence actions (Not automatic, must be quantifiable),

Which led to...

- 2. The need to look at the social fabric of societies. This establishes that criteria have to be articulated through two parallel 'lenses':
 - Technical Lens
 - Social Lens

How Society Organises

- Perspectives on Process involves a view of both
 - Social lens particularly grassroots groups and experts on gender mainstreaming, and
 - Merge with Technical lens using knowledge by those involved in land administration.
- Pilot at a local level, but scale up to Large,
- People- Grassroots and Land professionals draw together with Change Agents



Criteria Evaluation Framework

- · Implications of this action in terms of gender? And
- · Making land management gender sensitive?
 - Input Criteria = What information & Structures are needed?
 - Process Criteria = How this information is used?
 - Output Criteria = What impact will it have on women and men and how is this evaluated?



Land Records Management

Example, Criteria framework:

 Input: Include marital status of the individuals (wives, daughters, inter household relationships)

 Process: Transfer existing rights claims to higher levels of tenure security. Also Training.

Output: Measurable, effectively includes individuals equitably
