We are cordially inviting Young Surveyors/Professionals and youth to apply for participation in the Social Tenure Domain Model – Training of Trainers. The 3.5 days training will be organized as joint activity of:

- § International Federation of Surveyors (FIG),
- § Global Land Tool Network (GLTN),
- § FIG Young Surveyors Network (FIG YSN)

The training is scheduled for 13th – 16th June, 2014, immediately prior to the XXV FIG Congress from 16th – 21st June 2014. The Social Tenure Domain Model (STDM) is a concept and tool developed by the Global Land Tool Network (GLTN), as facilitated by UN-Habitat, to support pro-poor land administration. STDM is a model and a way of thinking realized through a tool using open source GIS software packages. The purpose of implementing this tool is to alleviate poverty and serve the needs of the poor in support of land issues and land security.

In the future the Global Land Tool Network may require experts and trainers with technical background and field experience in surveying, mapping and GIS, to support and guide the technical and technological implementation of STDM pilots and upcoming projects. Therefore, this Social Tenure Domain Model – Training of Trainers is targeted to Young Surveyors who want to understand this tool and concept and become champions in the application of STDM. Youth “land champions” working with GLTN civil society and grassroots organisation partners are also invited to apply.

About STDM

The STDM is an initiative of GLTN, as facilitated by UN-Habitat, to support pro-poor land administration. STDM is meant specifically for developing countries, countries with very little cadastral coverage in urban areas with slums, or in rural customary areas. It can also be applied in, but not limited to, post conflict/disaster, property management vis-à-vis taxation and natural resource management scenarios. The focus of STDM is on relationships between people and land, as distinct from the level of formalization, or legality of these relationships. STDM is a specialization of the ISO-standard Land Administration Domain Model (LADM).
