BABY BOOMERS

Born between 1946 - 1964

Generational nickname from the boom of post-war births in the mid-century More men have attended college Retired or nearing retirement age

GEN X

Born between 1965 - 1980

Not born immediately after the war and not exposed to modern technology in childhood 53 million in modern workforce Values work-life balance

GEN Y

Millennials

Born between 1981 - 1994

Peak childhood in early 2000s 39% have a bachelor's degree or higher More women have attended college Millennials are the largest generation of voting age 53% of Millennials are currently living at home

GEN Z

Born between 1995 - 2009

Most racially and ethnically diverse 9 million people in the workforce 5% of total working population Grew up with technology
